Art

Monochromatic -

How can patterns be used in art?
Children will develop their understanding of pattern. They will create a variety of monochromatic patterns and look at animals, mosaic flooring, wallpaper and mehndi designs. They will learn how to describe patterns considering line, shape and space and study the work of designers and artists. They will develop their mastery of pencil control, working to draw detailed and precise patterns. They will learn that humans have been designing patterns for thousands of years all around the world.



The children will discover what London was like in 1666. They will make simple comparisons between then and the present day. They will learn what happened on the night of 2nd September 1666 when the Great Fire of London started, why the fire spread quickly and how it was tackled. They will be introduced to key historical individuals, such as Thomas Farriner, Samuel Pepys, King Charles II and Christopher Wren. They will study evidence from after the fire, to help them form opinions about what happened over 350 years ago.

What is the good news that Christians say Jesus brings?

Pupils will learn about the concept of 'Gospel' and the good news of forgiveness, peace and love that Christians believe Jesus brings. They will learn about the instructions that Jesus gives in the Bible and will take time to consider whether Jesus' good news is only good news for Christians or whether there are things for people from different worldviews to consider.

Science

Animals including Humans

Children will learn about different common animals and be able to discuss their features using scientific language such as feathers, beak, scales, fins etc. They will begin to identify similarities and differences between different animals. Children will also look at the diets of different animals and compare these. Finally, children will focus on humans, identifying body parts and linking these to senses as well as discussing the similarities and differences between humans.


Programming 2: Bee-Bots
